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

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

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

Kelsi, your journey as a Psychic/Clairvoyant has been inspiring. Could you share with us how your personal style reflects the videos you create?

I love to dress up in different styles. I'm always open to trying new things! My personal style mainly goes off of what energy I wake up with, some days I like to just wear a big t-shirt and style it with jewelry, different purses, sunglasses, and platform sneakers. Then other days, I'll dress up a bit more with some cute dresses, boots, crop tops, and jeans! I go with whatever feels authentic to me that day!

Your social media presence spans across YouTube and TikTok, where you've cultivated a massive following for quite some time now. How has your style changed over the years?

It has been such a wild yet fulfilling journey and I am so grateful. My spiritual healing journey has guided me to start wearing whatever I think is fun, weird, artsy, and cute! Growing up, I would always try to fit in with everyone else but it never felt right. I was always different and had my quirks. Sometimes, I would try to add in little pieces that felt more like me, but then would get made fun of for it at school.

Then, as I got older and allowed myself to step outside of the box, I stopped listening to the ego which sometimes likes to tell us that we have to be like everyone else. I started listening to my soul more, let myself be free with what I wore, and finally allowed myself to embrace my highest self. It took me a long time to realize I was the only person holding myself back.

Kelsi, your YouTube channel has gained a lot of traction recently. Could you tell us about the inspiration behind starting it and how it has evolved over time?

I actually started my social media journey on YouTube. At first it was daily vlogs, challenges, game reviews, and guidelines on how to start a YouTube channel! It's really cool because my viewers have been watching me evolve spiritually and mentally for the past six to seven years.

I was always drawn to the paranormal, as I had experiences from a young age. It's something I was scared of for a long time, naturally, so I wanted to face my fears and understand it more. One day, my boyfriend and I were exploring some old spots in his town and we stumbled across an old sewer tunnel. I remember feeling the spirit of a girl there and it sparked my curiosity so, I went online and googled "haunted sewer tunnel".

Another YouTuber and now good friend of mine, OmargoshTV, popped up! He would visit haunted

places around the world, and I was so intrigued yet scared. Something was pulling me in that direction of exploring the unknown. This is when I decided to start visiting haunted locations around the world! I gradually started allowing myself to see more and connect with the paranormal realms. That led to my intense spiritual journey, which led to achieving enlightenment. It was a calling, I listened, and this is where it has taken me.

Your game, Kelsi Davies: Haunt Escape, has generated a lot of excitement among your followers. What can you tell us about the storyline and gameplay mechanics that set it apart from other games in the genre?

Level 1 is actually in haunted sewer tunnels which we named "The Moonlight Tunnels". There is a story of a family who passed tragically in a car accident and their souls are trapped in the tunnels. There is also a little girl who went missing and is believed to have wandered into the tunnels and never returned. Aaron Hibberd is the game developer and has done such a wonderful job. It really has been a passion project and we've had a lot of fun doing it.

What sets this game apart from others is that it is like an interactive escape room. To escape, you have to help each spirit move on, find ways to communicate with them, and you get to see them like I do! However, there are negative entities that seem to be keeping these souls trapped there so you have to find ways to fight them off, as well as other enemies! We are currently working on Level 2 which includes Lola, my haunted doll, a whole new part of the story, and more!

Looking ahead, what are your plans for expanding your YouTube channel and game development endeavors? Are there other projects or genres you're interested in exploring in the future?

I genuinely love creating long form YouTube content. The community we have built is so loving, accepting, and supportive. In the future, I plan to focus on growing our community, and outside of YouTube, taking steps towards my acting career which is a passion of mine. There are some really exciting things already in the works, so stay tuned!

You're known for your distinct style and ability to mix high fashion with everyday wear. How do you stay true to your personal aesthetic while also experimenting with new trends?

By staying true to myself! I know what clothes make me feel like the highest version of myself and the most confident with myself. Everyone will have a different perception of you and what "looks good" on you.



The most important perception is your own! Just have fun with it, play around, keep an open mind and you will thrive.

How do you ensure your content resonates with your audience while staying authentic to yourself?

For my short form content, I usually try to find strategic ways to keep up with trends and keeping people entertained while sticking with the spooky niche I know and love. My brain goes a million miles per hour with constant new ideas, so I will write down my ideas in the notes app on my phone and then sit with it. Ideas will come to me throughout the day and I will let them build and build until there is a concept that I am excited about!

My content is also influenced by my daily spiritual/ paranormal experiences. It's always something new and interesting to share. With my horror acting skits, I love implementing the "shock factor" by making it as bizarre and unpredictable as possible. I'm a weird spooky girl, and I embrace that in every aspect of my content. I also get a lot of inspiration and even re-create skits by Jack Stauber. His art is so eye-catching to me as well as many others.

How was it growing up being spiritually gifted? Did you wear anything unique because of your gift?

It was very confusing. I would see the spirit of this man constantly, which I later learned was my great grandfather who died before my mom was born. My family was not very spiritual and I did not grow up in any religion, so these experiences would be brushed off as it being "just a dream" or my "imagination". Little did I know, the Native American side of my family was filled with psychics and mediums.

They all passed before I was born so I never got to meet them and understand that it was different to be super open to the spiritual realms. Society likes to suppress these "gifts" that every one of us is capable of opening up as we are all spirit having a human experience. As far as what I wore being connected to these gifts, I was always drawn to geometrical patterns and symbols in clothing when I was younger. It all makes sense now!

How do you empower your followers to embrace their unique style choices through your content and collaborations?

The most beautiful part of this human experience is that we get to experience individuality! I love to just share my life in the most authentic way possible, by not being afraid of judgement or criticism. Hopefully this energy can spread towards those who watch my videos and influence them to embrace their unique, beautiful selves!

What trends in fashion are you most excited about right now, and why do you think they resonate with your audience?

I love seeing different eras come back and mix with modern clothing! Right now there is a lot of style from the 90s and early 2000s coming back which is super fun to see! The low-rise baggy jeans, big sunglasses, fun purses, and bulky shoes are great.

I feel like people are getting more confident in just mixing different styles and patterns together to make it fun and quirky! I think it resonates with my audience by having more of this bold look, giving the collective more confidence to throw different things together and have fun with it.

What is your favorite outfit you've ever worn and why?

I haven't had an all-time favorite outfit just yet... but I see one coming in the future. It's a fully customized, unique outfit that will definitely be worn on a red carpet. Am I manifesting this, or is this a vision? I'm not 100% sure, but I keep seeing it in my minds eye!

Fashion has a powerful influence on culture and society. How do you see your role as an influencer in shaping conversations around sustainability and inclusivity within the fashion industry?

It is very important to have that diversity by appreciating fashion from all over the world, bringing different cultures together, and having it be more inclusive towards every body type! I'm excited to see where fashion goes as the vibrations of Earth rise!

Looking ahead, what are your goals for the future in terms of expanding your brand and furthering your impact on your community through your online platforms?

I would love to help others on their spiritual journeys while continuing to share my own. There is a big reason I am being pulled towards the entertainment industry, and I'm excited to see where it all takes me.

I hope to help others by eventually being a part of spiritual retreats, spreading knowledge of the benefits of plant medicines, and helping people with deep healing. I'm just letting the universe take me wherever I need to go.

Summer Helene Executive Producer Interview by Jennifer Gibbs

Who are you and what do you do?

My name is Summer Helene, and I can make you famous!

I've gone from wearing wings and high heels as a Victoria's Secret model to wielding a magic wand and making the impossible, possible. I realized I was better at helping others shine than sticking to a script myself.

What inspired your shift from modeling to behind-the-camera work?

It turns out I hate the spotlight, I wanted to be an actress, but don't like being touched or talked to, and can't pretend to like people I don't—classic Australian traits. I'm good at making money and prefer working behind the scenes.

How do you identify individuals or projects with the potential for fame?

It takes a mix of psychology and extreme violence- at least in MMA! I look for authenticity, a unique spark, and the ability to resonate with audiences. It's about finding the perfect blend of personality, talent, and story.

What's your process for discovering and nurturing talents?

I don't nurture; I provide opportunities. My process involves listening and observing potential stars to see how they connect with others. If they have talent, I give them a platform to develop it @GodBrandIt.

How have your decisions shaped famous careers?

I create stars; you either have what it takes or you don't. I provide a path and help those who take it - I will never give a platform to somebody that doesn't earn it.

What advice do you give aspiring talents for standing out?

Be genuine and embrace what makes you unique. In a world full of imitations, originality is your greatest asset. Stay true to yourself, and let your personality shine. Professionalism and perseverance are key to making a lasting impression.

How do you balance intuition with industry trends?

I rely heavily on intuition but also stay informed about industry trends. It's about balancing timeless appeal with current relevance, ensuring that projects connect with audiences today and in the future. My team is my weapon and I am smart enough to listen to those smarter than me.

How do you assess the global potential of talents?

Global potential hinges on universal appeal and relatability. I look for stories and personalities that can transcend cultural boundaries. Success globally often comes from connecting with people on a fundamental, human level—and a good social media following doesn't hurt!

How do you support talents' long-term growth?

I don't encourage; I inform. I provide them with the tools to diversify and explore new opportunities. It's up to them to take those opportunities and stay adaptable for long-term success.

What strategic advice do you offer talents for staying relevant?

Leverage social media and relationships. It's straightforward but essential for maintaining relevance.

What milestones do you prioritize for long-term impact?

I prioritize financial achievement and encourage talent to build a legacy. This not only enhances their brand but also contributes positively to the industry.

How has shaping careers influenced your perspective?

Entertainment can change the world. Celebrity is power. It's about more than just creating stars; it's about shaping narratives and influencing culture, for better or worse. Nobody has ever accused me of being warm, but I foster children and I would prefer for the world not end in a nuclear holocaust for them, so I try to be very selective about the people I give power to.

Who do you most admire?

Dolly Parton- if you know anything about her, her life, upbringing, flare for fashion and the quiet dignity in how she dealt with criticism, you know what makes her worth admiring.

What are you working on now?

I'm currently working with BBC, ESPN, pitching Hallmark, Lifetime-You name it, I work there! Along with more than a dozen reality shows, including "Queen of Temecula" starring Brandie Newman (she is in this issue too) It's like watching a glamorous train wreck - you can't look away. My girl Elley Ringo is in this magazine, we are working with her and of course I have Hades and Persephone (Receiver of Many), an Amazon best seller we are adapting for television! I have shows about cage fighting- if it's entertaining, I have it... The truth is I love each project, every show brings something unique, whether it's a hard-hitting documentary or an entertaining sports narrative.

Your style is known for its eclectic yet effortlessly chic vibe. Can you share with us some of the key influences and inspirations that shape your fashion choices, both on and off the stage?

Are there any fashion designers whose work you find particularly resonant with your own style?

I love the teuta matoshi gowns, they feel very fairy-esque and I love the attention to detail and how elements of nature are incorporated into the designs.

When it comes to fashion, who are your ultimate icons and why? How have they influenced your approach to style?

I am very inspired by Michel Ngo and Joey Thao, as they designed my beautiful tour outfits last year!! They are both incredibly talented and did a wonderful job of encapsulating my personality through fashion.

Could you walk us through how you select the perfect ensemble for a show?

Last year I definitely wanted "butterfly fairy" energy. I spoke a lot with Joey and Michael about creating the best looks for stage, but a priority is always bringing in that element of fantasy and fun.

What are three essential items every woman should have in her wardrobe, in your opinion? How do these pieces reflect your own fashion philosophy?

I think a good flattering pair of jeans is everything, and it's a staple I fall back on often. I would also say a little black dress, and a comfortable pair of neutral heels or boots. I have a pair of black heeled boots I practically live in! Mike Myers is one of the reasons I wanted to write comedy. Which is where I first began in ghost writing stand up comedy jokes. So, I decided it would be fun to wear the Austin Powers blue velvet suit to an event. It got lots of laughs and was definitely unexpected with was a lot of fun.

A Portrait of Innovation: Trail Blazing Career

Can you tell me about your early experiences with art and how they shaped your career today?

I came from a family lineage of artists, so naturally I was encouraged by their influence.

Winning "Best Artist" at the Laguna Beach Festival of Arts at such a young age must have been significant. How did that achievement impact your aspirations and confidence in pursuing art professionally?

Yes, it was significant at the time, as it gave me self-confidence.

What influenced your transition from majoring in illustration to a career in professional dancing? How did your artistic background contribute to your dance career?

An MGM scout discovered me and offered the opportunity to join their show. And, actually, it worked in reverse. My dance career gave me the work ethic that carried over to my art.

Your passion for makeup developed during your time as a professional dancer, how did dancing influence your approach to makeup artistry?

In my preparation for dancing on stage, I fell in love with the incredible transformation makeup provided. Much like the transformation from a blank canvas to a finished painting.

What prompted you to resume your artistic education, and how did this period influence your career trajectory?

My husband and I moved back to San Clemente where we grew up. Through friends, I discovered a special art academy (Watts Atelier) just a short drive away which was attended by serious students from all over the world. The environment of working with such great instructors and talented students motivated and inspired me.

What inspired your transition from painting to makeup artistry, and how do you blend your makeup skills into portrait painting?

At that time in my life, my interest transitioned from painting to makeup. Applying makeup on people provided me with a structural foundation for understanding human anatomy. This in turn was a natural transition to portrait painting. Working with renowned photographers and magazines has given you a diverse portfolio, so could you share a memorable project that particularly challenged or inspired you?

It was a body painting project for Vogue Magazine with the great American fashion photographer Herb Ritts. I was challenged with body painting a snakeskin pattern on a model. I spent the night laying it out, making templates, and when I arrived on site the Art Director suggested we make the design loose and abstract. In a state of anxiety, I relied on my art background and just went for it. It was a resounding success!

How do you balance the artistic freedom of body painting with the specific needs of commercial photography and magazine work?

Pre-production work with the photographer and magazine are discussed in advance. That becomes the foundation and framework for the body painting component.

What advice would you give to aspiring artists who are interested in pursuing a career similar to yours in makeup artistry and body painting?

Make sure you learn hair as well as makeup in the beginning since you will start with lower budgeted jobs that cannot afford separate hair and makeup. Find someone that you can assist, is accomplished and willing to become a mentor and share their journey of success.

Looking ahead, what are some artistic goals or projects that you hope to accomplish in the next tew years?

I am always working to improve my skills. The biggest satisfaction comes from seeing one's hands create what is in one's head.
